HIGH SCHOOL EXIT SURVEY REPORT FOR CLASS OF 2009, AKINS HIGH SCHOOL

The sixth annual Austin Independent School to (AISD) High School Exit Survey was administered online to seniors in every AISIQh school during Spring@9. Facilitators on each campus, primarilyProject ADVANCEcounselors, were responsible to survey that all graduating seniors were given the opporttynto complete the survey.

This report contains the resulfor the Akins High School Class of 2009. Where available, longitudinal data are presented to compare thich 2009 responses. In addition, average results from all AISD high schools are presedtelongside results for Akins formparison purposes. In total, 3,365 students in the Class of 2009 completeds through, including 282 students from Akins. Longitudinal tests for statistical gnificance were conducted with strict-level data (see district-level report). Table 1 presenten gitudinal response rates by campus by district. Next, major findings are presented, followed by open-ended campus lesponses and, finally, responses to the multiple choice items from the survey.

The report is structured as follows. Firstprize summary of key fidings from the 2009 High School Exit Survey is provided. This summaryoils owed by a selection of open-ended student comments that capture the predominant themesethatged from the student comments. Last, the detailed, item-specific results for each spines from the survey are presented.

- x Employment. Akins seniors appeared to have worked hours during the school year the other AISD high school seniors lowever, the percentage who reported working in the sur was similar to that of other high school seniors.
- x College preparation More students at Akins began thinkingout college as a possibility a high school later in school thanddiheir district peers. Compared seniors district-wide, Akin seniors appeared to have lestegge preparation. Lower percegtes of Akins seniors indicate taking college entrance tests, test preparations sels, and completing commity college class kins seniors were more likely to have applied -year colleges, buttere substantially less likely to have applied to 4-year institution.

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Figure 1. Now Indicate The Number Of Hours Rer Week That You Have Worked During Last Summer. (Q18a)




Figure 2. Now Indicate The Number Of Hours




Figure 4. On Average, What Percentage Of YouStudy, Research And Homework Was Done Without Distractions (E.G., Television, Music, IM, Texting, Phone Calls)? (Item 20)




