

HIGH SCHOOL EXIT SURVEY REPORT FOR CLASS OF 2009, CROCKETT HIGH SCHOOL

The sixth annual Austin Independent School District (AISD) High School Exit Survey was administered online to seniors in every AISD high school during Spring 2009. Facilitators on each campus, primarily *Project ADVANCE* counselors, were responsible for ensuring that all graduating seniors were given the opportunity to complete the survey.

This report contains the results for the Crockett High School Class of 2009. Where available, longitudinal data are presented to compare with the 2009 responses. In addition, average results from all AISD high schools are presented alongside results for Crockett for comparison purposes. In total, 3,365 students in the Class of 2009 completed the survey, including 325 students from Crockett. Longitudinal tests for statistical significance were conducted with district-level data (see district-level report). Table 1 presents longitudinal response rates by campus and by district. Next, major findings are presented, followed by open-ended campus-level responses and, finally, responses to the multiple choice items from the survey.

The report is structured as follows. First, a brief summary of key findings from the 2009 High School Exit Survey is provided. This summary is followed by a selection of open-ended student comments that capture the predominant themes that emerged from the student comments. Last, the detailed, item-specific results for each question from the survey are presented.

Major Findings

Student responses are organized into seven general topics areas: Open-Ended Comments; Postsecondary Intentions and Family Support; High School Experiences, Campus Climate, and Civic Engagement; Instruction and Technology; Postsecondary Preparation and Advising; and Final Thoughts. Some of the notable trends at this campus include:

Employment. Crockett seniors appeared to work more hours during the summer and their senior year compared to district seniors as a whole.

College preparation. Compared to other seniors, it seemed fewer Crockett seniors reported taking college entrance exams. Crockett seniors made considerable strides from 2007-2008 in the percentage of respondents who reported they had applied for either a 2-year or 4-year colleges. However, a smaller share of Crockett seniors felt well prepared to meet their college and career








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Figure 2. Now Indicate The Number Of Hours Per Week That You Have Worked During Your Senior Year. (Q18b)








Figure 6. Do Your Parents Use Parentconnect/Gradespeed To Monitor Your Grades? (Item 27)


