

AISD Student Climate Survey: Results for Spring 2013 Through 2016

INTERNATIONAL

Evidence indicates that positive school climate fosters a positive learning environment for students. Also, researchers have documented that a positive school climate helps students from economically disadvantaged schools to beat the odds (Voight, Austin, & Hanson, 2013).
