

HIGH SCHOOL EXIT SURVEY REPORT FOR CLASS OF 2009, LASA

INDIVIDUAL ITEM RESPONSES FOR LIBERAL ARTS AND SCIENCE ACADEMY (LASA) HIGH SCHOOL

OPEN ENDED COMMENTS

The responses below are to the question, "What is the ONE thing that you especially want the administration of AISD to know?"

One hundred and twenty-four (65%) provided a response. Most comments focused on the exceptionality of LASA and internet use restrictions. Commonly identified themes expressed by the Class of 2009¹ include:

LASA and LBJ. The split between LASA and LBJ seemed to create tension among the students. "Please treat LASA better, we always get ignored, or have programs or rule applied to us that are onerous and unnecessary for us. We would really do better with our own campus too." "No one likes the split between LBJ and LASA. It feels like segregation. Maybe you should give some more funding to LBJ. Maybe you should campaign to change people's attitudes and how the administrators/hall monitors treat the students differently from the two different schools. I'm just tired of seeing my black friends being told to 'go back downstairs' (the hall monitors think they're skipping class, because they think they're LBJ students hanging out upstairs when they're really LASA students)." "GIVE LASA THE ABILITY TO MANAGE ITS OWN SCHOOL. GIVE US OUR OWN BUILDING. OUR ADMINISTRATION KNOWS HOW TO EDUCATE US MORE PROFICIENTLY THAN AISD. SO PLEASE, IF YOU WISH US TO ACHIEVE HIGHER LEARNING, LEAVE US ALONE."

Internet restrictions. Several students complained about the restrictions on internet usage. "Seriously, remove the internet blocking. It's basic supply and demand, the reason we have a drug problem, etc. If you take something away, people want it more. If you removed the ban, it would not negatively effect schoolwork, it would improve moral, and it would result in fewer disciplinary actions." "I believe that AISD is too strict about its internet policy. I don't understand why games, videos, and music are not allowed in class, as long as they are not disturbisat

Figure 1. Now Indicate The Number Of Hours Per Week That You Have Worked During Last Summer. (Q18a)




Figure 4. On Average, What Percentage Of Your Study, Research And Homework Was Done Without Distractions (E.G., Television, Music, IM, Texting, Phone Calls)? (Item 20)





Figure 9a. What Is The One ThingThat Was Most Important To Keeping You Going Through School All The Way To Graduation? (Item 48, LASA)




Figure 9b. What Is The One ThingThat Was Most Important To Keeping You Going Through School All The Way To Graduation? (Item 48, All High Schools)
