Requirements for Use

SAR-SSP is currently available at no cost to community service providers working with AISD students. Organizations interested in using the tool must have a written agreement with AISD, have their services registered in a4gA7tduvicMap 7r86 cruttpY

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How the Secure Web Interface Works

Trained program staff from approved agencies can upload files containing student names, AISD student ID numbers, and school numbers into a secure web-based interface. This information is cross checked against AISD enrollment data to ensure the accuracy of the information submitted. After a file has been uploaded, the user is prompted to select outcomes related to expected program impact (see data options below). SAR-SSP then generates a report listing the selected outcomes as well as other descriptive information (grade level, gender, ethnicity, and economic disadvantage). Users also have the option of selecting a comparison group. The comparison group can either be the same student program participants at a different point in time (i.e., pre- or post-intervention longitudinal design), or a randomly selected set of students who are matched on user-specified demographic criteria (i.e., cross sectional design). After the comparison group has been chosen, a report is produced which can be exported to either PDF or MS Excel formats.
